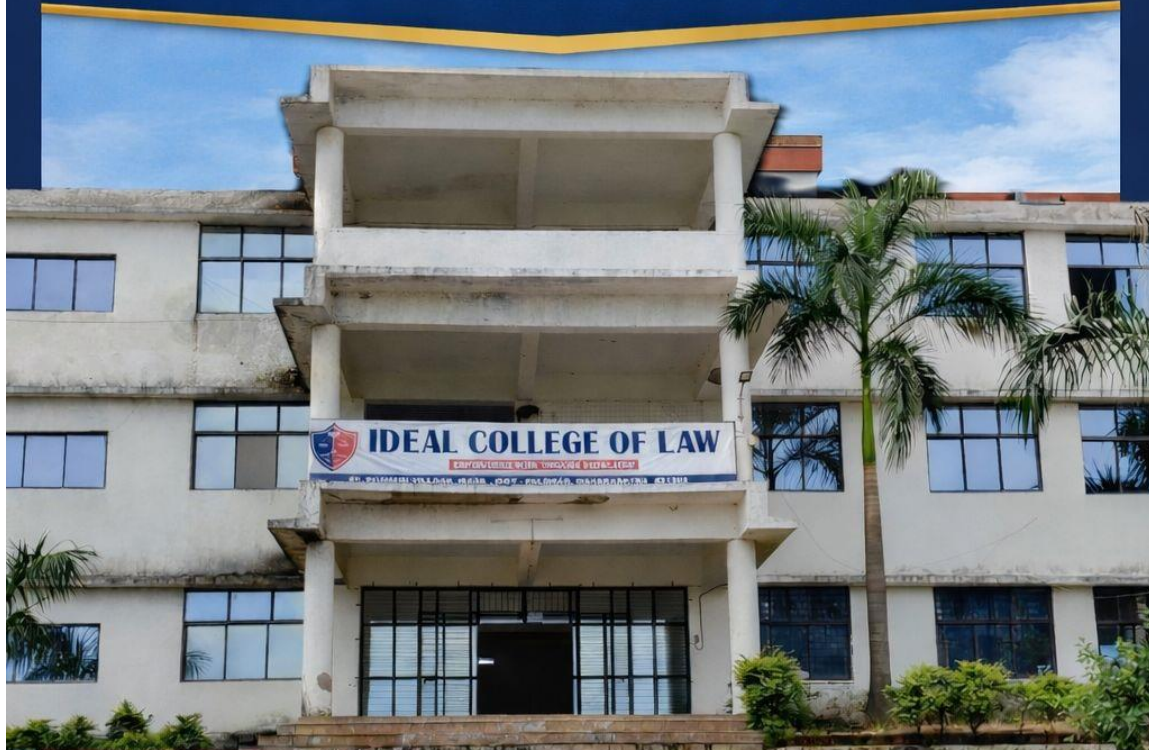

HISTORY AND HERITAGE

History and Heritage of Ideal College of Law

The Ideal College of Law is established in the year 2019 and enjoys a preeminent reputation for excellence in the field of legal education.

Inception : Until 2018 there was no College or any Institution providing Legal education for legal officers and lawyers in the remote area of Village Poshari, Taluka Wada, District Palghar. The Institution was established with the vision of providing quality legal education to students, especially from rural and semi-urban areas. The institution is founded with a strong commitment to promote justice, equality, and legal awareness in society. Since its inception, the college has been dedicated to nurturing competent legal professionals who are not only academically sound but also socially responsible. Over the years, Ideal College of Law has steadily grown in terms of infrastructure, academic excellence, and student participation in various co-curricular and extracurricular activities.

The Committee Of Ideal Foundation was constituted and it was unanimously decided to establish Law College and accordingly Ideal College of Law was established in the year 2019. The very first course had more than 75 students/ This marked the beginning of a rapidly successful run for the Institution. Soon the Ideal College grew up and the intake of 180 students permission was being granted by University of Mumbai after 2 years of establishment, in imparting effective training of giving a distinguished class of formally trained Judicial Officers and Lawyers.

Ideal College of Law received its affiliation from University of Mumbai) in 2019 and has retained the same ever since. Regular Classes are held in the morning. The Institution recognised the need for a Principal and Mrs. Manali V was appointed as the first Principal while the faculty strength increased to five with the appointment of ten additional Professors.

Ideal College of Law continues to be an Institution exclusively for the Students of law. In addition to the old building, the College now has an Annexe Building, January 2020 onwards additional Big Class rooms and Big Library with a big Moot Court Room and Auditorium Hall has a rich heritage and pedigree. The students who have passed out from the portals of Ideal College of Law have distinguished themselves at the Bar, the Judiciary and the Academic.

The College derives its strength and ethos from the highly qualified and dedicated faculty. COURSES

BACHELOR DEGREES

Ideal Collge of Law offers two degree courses in law: (1) Three Year (LL.B. General) and (2) Five Year (BLS LL.B.) and one Master Course in LL.M

Three Year Law Course, leading to a LL.B. degree is a six semester full-time course. On completion of the Three Year course, i.e. after the 6th semester, the LL.B. degree is awarded. Students who desire to study law, but do not wish to practice as advocates are eligible for the LL.B. (General) Degree, at the end of 2nd Years i.e. after the 4th semester. They are, however, not eligible to practice as advocates.

Five Year Law Course, leading to B. L. S. LL. B. is a ten semester full-time course. The first and the Second Year of the Five Year course, i.e. 1st to 4th semester is a “PreLaw” course. The students of the Five Year Law Course are awarded B.L.S. (Bachelor of Legal Science) degree at the end of the Third Year, (i.e. 6th semester) and on completion of Five Years, (10th semester) LL.B. degree is awarded.

LL.M leading to two years Masters Course :

ADMISSION TO THE FIRST YEAR OF THREE YEAR & FIVE YEAR LAW COURSE:-

- Admission process for the first year of the Three Year Law Course (LL.B) and Five Year Law Course (B.L.S. LL.B) will start as per schedule declared by CET Cell.

- Admission must be taken by the student in person, by submitting the essential original documents.
- Admissions to the First Year of LL.B and B.L.S. LL. B will be done as per the rules of Government of Maharashtra, CET Cell, University of Mumbai etc.
- All the reservations shall be applicable to candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria specified by Government of Maharashtra, CET Cell & respective authorities from time to time.
- For Eligibility Criteria, rules, admission details and essential documents kindly read the Information Brochure of CET Cell, Relevant Government Gazettes, notification etc.
- Students who are working are required to submit No Objection Certificate of Employer in the College.
- The Candidates admitted for the First Year of LL.B (Three Year Law Course) and B.L.S. LL.B. (Five Year Law Course) are bound to comply with University requirements regarding 'Registration' with University of Mumbai failing which their admission shall stand cancelled.
- Transfer Certificate / Leaving Certificate is required to be submitted.
- Foreign students seeking admission should produce his/her Passport and student visa at the time of admission. Tourist Visas or Entry Visas will not be considered as proper documents in this regard.
- At the time of admission, every student must undertake to attend a minimum 75% of the total number of lecture held in each semester. The failure to comply shall result in such defaulting students getting debarred from appearing at the examination and their names shall be duly displayed on office board/s and shall also be put up on college website.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE SEMESTERS :

Five Years LL.B Course

A candidate, in order to be eligible for admission to the Third Semester, must have either passed in the First and Second semesters or should have received an exemption in at least four Papers of the First and Second semester examination.

Similarly, for a candidate to be eligible for admission for the Fourth Semester, he/she must have successfully kept the term for the Third Semester, irrespective of the result of the Third Semester examination. A candidate for being eligible for admission for the Fifth Semester, must have passed the First & Second Semester, & must have either passed in Third & Fourth Semester or must have got exemption in at least 4 papers of the Third & Fourth Semester Examinations.

A candidate, for being eligible for admission for the Sixth Semester, must have successfully kept the terms for the Fifth Semester, irrespective of the result of the Fifth Semester examination.

For promotion of LL.B students to higher from semester VI to VII of 5 yrs programme, the students have to clear at least 7 courses out of 10 courses of the year from which promotion is applied for including the courses on applied components.

A candidate, for being eligible for admission to the Eighth Semester, must have successfully kept the terms for the Seventh Semester, irrespective of the result of the Seventh Semester examination.

For promotion of LL.B students to higher from semester VIII to IX of 5 yrs programme, the students have to clear at least 7 courses out of 10 courses of the year from which promotion is applied for including the courses on applied components.

A candidate, for being eligible for admission to the Tenth Semester must have successfully kept the terms for the Ninth Semester, irrespective of the result of the Ninth Semester examination

Three Years LL.B. Course :

For promotion of LL.B students to higher from semester II to III of 3 yrs programme, the students have to clear at least 7 courses out of 10 courses of the year from which promotion is applied for including the courses on applied components.

Similarly, for a candidate to be eligible for admission for the Fourth Semester, he/she must have successfully kept the term for the Third Semester, irrespective of the result of the Third Semester examination.

For promotion of LL.B students to higher from semester IV to V of 3 yrs programme, the students have to clear at least 7 courses out of 10 courses of the year from which promotion is applied for including the courses on applied components.

A candidate, for being eligible for admission for the Sixth Semester, must have successfully kept the terms for the Fifth Semester, irrespective of the result of the Fifth Semester examination.

EXAMINATION

There is a University Examination held at the end of each Semester. Candidates pursuing the LL.B (3 Years Law Course) or the BLS LL.B (5 Years Law Course) are required to pass all the examinations held for each of the semester.

In accordance with University of Mumbai-Circular No.UG27 of 2004 and Exam/K.MU.K/1851/2018 Dated 18th May 2018, the following examinations will be conducted by the respective affiliated college on behalf of the University.

Common question papers and the time-table are provided by the University.

5 Years Law Course:

- 1 st Year (Semester 1 and Semester 2)
- 2 nd Year (Semester 3 and Semester 4)
- 3 rd Year (Semester 5 and Semester 6)
- 4 th Year (Semester 7 and Semester 8)

3 Years Law Course :

- 1 st Year (Semester 1 and Semester 2)
- 2 nd Year (Semester 3 and Semester 4)

The remaining examinations, i.e. those listed below, will be conducted by the University of Mumbai

5 th Year Five Year Law Course (Semester 9 and Semester 10)

3 rd Year Three Year Law Course (Semester 5 and Semester 6)

The LL.B Degree in either of the courses in Law will not be conferred upon a candidate unless the candidate has passed in, and cleared all the papers prescribed for each Semester Examination in accordance with the provisions relating to each Semester Examination. The performance of the students will be evaluated by the Examination to be conducted at the end of each Semester and also by his/her performance in the Practical

Training Subject Papers as per the guidelines issued from time to time by the University of Mumbai, Bar Council of India etc.

LL.M

The LL.M. course is intended to produce academicians and lawyers of competence and expertise, as it is imperative that the students should have an in-depth knowledge not only of the concepts and basic principles of Law but also of social, political and economic aspects of law and the dynamics of law.

Duration of the course

Two years consisting of four semesters. Intake: 60 (20 students per Group)

- 1) Constitutional & Administrative Law (Group I)
- 2) Business Law (Group II)
- 3) Law of Intellectual Property & Information Technology (Group III)

Timing of the lectures LL.M.

Lectures are held between 4.00 p.m. to 8.00 p.m.

Rules of Admission

The minimum qualification for a candidate making an application for admission to the LL.M. degree course is an LL.B. degree of this University or any other University recognized by UGC and equivalent to this University and CET conducted by University of Mumbai.

Reservation

All the reservations shall be applicable to candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria specified by Government of Maharashtra & respective authorities from time to time.

Attendance

No student shall be allowed to appear for the LL.M examination unless he/she has attended 75% of the total number of lectures and seminars conducted in each Semester.

Admission Process and Guidelines of Ideal College of Law

The admission process of Ideal College of Law is designed to be transparent and Merit based. Following are the rules and regulations of the College affiliated to University of Mumbai and approved by Bar Council of Maharashtra and government authorities.

Fee Refund Policy of Ideal College of Law
