> RTI: Details of Central Public Information Officer (CPIO) and Appellate Authority (wherever applicable) -

Central Public Information Officers (CPIOs) are designated officials in central public authorities responsible for handling RTI applications within 30 days. Details of CPIOs and First Appellate Authorities (FAA) for specific ministries or departments can be searched, viewed, and accessed on the RTI Online Portal by selecting the relevant organization.

The Right to Information Act, 2005 was introduced to help citizens secure access to information under the control of public authorities and to promote transparency and accountability in the working of all public authority. As per the RTI Act, any person who desires to obtain any information can request in writing or online through RTI Online, by paying the requisite fee. On receiving a request for information under the RTI Act, a Central Public Information Officer or State Public Information Officer must provide the information requested or reject the request under any of the reasons specified in the RTI Act. In this article, we look at the process for requesting information through RTI online website.

> Circulars and Notices -

Notices and circulars are formal written communications used to convey information within or outside an organization. Notices are concise, boxed announcements for specific events or updates, usually displayed on notice boards. Circulars are broader, detailed letters sent to many people to share policy changes or

➤ Announcements -

An announcement is a formal, public, or official statement (spoken or written) that provides information about an event that has occurred or is planned, such as a wedding, company news, or public notice. It acts as a declaration, designed to inform a group of people, often used to make something known.

➤ Newsletters



Newsletters are regularly distributed digital or printed reports containing curated updates, news, and insights about a specific topic, business, or organization. They act as a vital marketing tool to build engaged audiences, nurture brand authority, and drive traffic directly to websites, bypassing social media algorithms.

➤ Job openings

Law graduates can pursue diverse careers as advocates, corporate legal advisors, or in the judiciary, with top roles including Solicitor, Legal Process Outsourcing (LPO) analyst, and Government Prosecutor. Major hiring sectors include top law firms, corporate houses (e.g., Tata, Reliance), and public service through exams.

Top Job Roles and Opportunities

- **Advocate/Litigation:** Practicing in civil or criminal courts,, including joining senior advocates or establishing an independent practice.
- **Corporate Legal Advisor/In-House Counsel:** Working within companies (e.g., banks, IT firms) to manage compliance, contracts, and IP, with roles such as Legal Manager or Compliance Officer.
- **Judiciary/Government Jobs :**Passing the State Judicial Services exam to become a Judge, or joining as a Public Prosecutor.
- **Law Firms:** Joining firms like Amarchand Mangaldas, Khaitan & Co., or Trilegal as an Associate.
- **Legal Process Outsourcing (LPO):** Providing specialized legal research and documentation services.

- **Legal Journalism/Publishing**: Writing for legal publications or reporting on court cases.
- **Academia**: Teaching law in universities after obtaining further qualifications like an LLM.

➤ Admission procedure and facilities provided to International Students -

BACHELOR DEGREES :

The Government Law College offers two degree courses in law: (1) Three Year (LL.B. General) and (2) Five Year (BLS LL.B.).

- i) **Three Year Law Course, leading to a LL.B. degree** is a 6 Semester full-time course. On completion of the Three Year course, i.e. after the 6th semester, the LL.B. degree is awarded. Students who desire to study law, but do not wish to practice as Advocates are eligible for the LL.B. (General) Degree at the end of 2nd Years i.e. after the 4th semester. They are, however, not eligible to practice as advocates.
- ii) **Five Year Law Course, leading to B. L. S. LL. B.** is a 10 Semester full-time course. The first and the Second Year of the Five Year course, i.e. 1st to 4th semester is a "PreLaw" Course. The students of the Five Year Law Course are awarded B.L.S. (Bachelor of Legal Science) degree at the end of the Third Year, (i.e. 6th semester) and on completion of Five Years, (10th semester) LL.B. degree is awarded.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE AND FACILITIES PROVIDED TO INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

FOR THE FIRST YEAR OF THREE YEAR & FIVE YEAR LAW COURSE :-

- Admission process for the first year of the Three Year Law Course (LL.B) and Five Year Law Course (B.L.S. LL.B) will be start as per schedule declared by CET Cell.
- Admission must be taken by the student in person, by submitting the essential original documents.
- Admissions to the First Year of LL.B and B.L.S. LL. B will be done as per the rules of Government of Maharashtra, CET cell, University of Mumbai etc.
- All the reservations shall be applicable to candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria specified by Government of Maharashtra, CET Cell & respective authorities from time to time.
- For Eligibility Criteria, rules, admission details and essential documents kindly read the Information Brochure of CET Cell, Relevant Government Gazettes, notification etc.
- Students who are working are required to submit No Objection Certificate of Employer in the College.

- The Candidates admitted for the First Year of LL.B (Three Year Law Course) and B.L.S. LL.B. (Five Year Law Course) are bound to comply with University requirements regarding 'Registration' with University of Mumbai failing which their admission shall stand cancelled.
- Transfer Certificate / Leaving Certificate is required to be submitted.
- Foreign students seeking admission should produce his/her Passport and student visa at the time of admission. Tourist Visas or Entry Visas will not be considered as proper documents in this regard.
- At the time of admission, every student must undertake to attend a minimum 75% of the total number of lecture held in each semester. The failure to comply shall result in such defaulting students getting debarred from appearing at the examination and their names shall be duly displayed on office board/s and shall also be put up on college website.
